


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## Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 42" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!

# **Cutting Instructions**

#### From each of Fabrics A and F, cut:

(3) 6-1/2" × WOF strips. Subcut:
 (15) 6-1/2" squares for the block centers

#### From Fabric B, cut:

(3) 7-1/4" × WOF strips. Subcut: (15) 7-1/4" squares for the Block 1 flying geese
(3) 4" × WOF strips. Subcut: (30) 4" squares for the Block 2 HSTs
(6) 3-7/8" × WOF strips. Subcut: (60) 3-7/8" squares for the Block 2 flying geese

#### From Fabric C, cut:

(6) 3-7/8" × WOF strips. Subcut:(60) 3-7/8" squares for the Block 1 flying geese

#### From Fabric D, cut:

(5) 3-1/2" × WOF strips. Subcut:
 (60) 3-1/2" squares for Block 1

#### From Fabric E, cut:

(3) 7-1/4" × WOF strips. Subcut:
 (15) 7-1/4" squares for the Block 2 flying geese

#### From Fabric G, cut:

(3) 4" × WOF strips. Subcut:(30) 4" squares for the Block 2 HSTs

#### From Fabric H/Binding, cut:

(7) 1-1/2" × WOF strips. Sew together, end-to-end, for inner borders
(7) 2-1/2" × WOF strips. Sew together, end-to-end, for the binding

#### From Borders fabric, cut:


(4) 4-1/2" × LOF strips for outer borders


# Assemble the Half-Square Triangles (HSTs)

**Step 1:** Pair a 4" Fabric B square with a 4" Fabric G square, RST. Mark a diagonal line on the wrong side of one square. Sew 1/4" away from both sides of the marked line. Cut on the marked line, creating (2) half-square triangles (HSTs). Press toward the darker fabric. Trim to 3-1/2" square. Repeat to make (60) B/G HSTs.

# Assemble the Flying Geese

**Step 2:** Pin (2) 3-7/8" Fabric C squares in opposing corners of a 7-1/4" Fabric B square, RST. The squares will overlap slightly in the center of the large square. Using a ruler, draw a diagonal line through the squares.






**Step 3:** Sew scant 1/4" seam on each side of the diagonal line. Set the seam by pressing it flat. Cut along the diagonal line, creating two identical units.

**Step 4:** Press the fabric toward smaller triangles. Repeat with the second unit.

**Step 5:** Place (1) 3-7/8" Fabric C square at the corner of sewn block unit. Draw diagonal line in pencil. Sew a scant 1/4" seam on each side of diagonal line. Set seam (press). Cut along diagonal line, creating two identical units.





**Step 6:** Press the seam toward smaller triangle. Trim off small dog ears left by the seam allowance. Trim to  $3-1/2'' \times 6-1/2''$  if necessary. Repeat to make (4) flying geese blocks.



**Step 7:** Repeat with all remaining 3-7/8" Fabric C squares and 7-1/4" Fabric B squares to make a total of (60) B/C flying geese blocks.

**Step 8:** Repeat Steps 2-7 with the 3-7/8" Fabric B squares and 7-1/4" Fabric E squares to make a total of (60) E/B flying geese blocks.

Arrange the units into three rows of three. Note the fabric placement and block orientation in the Block Assembly Diagram.

**Step 10:** Sew the units together to form rows. Press the seams away from the flying geese.

**Step 11:** Sew the rows together, nesting the seams and pressing the seams to one side to form the block.

Repeat to make (15) 12-1/2" Block 1 units.



# Assemble the Quilt



**Step 15:** Arrange the blocks into six rows of five blocks. Note the block placement and orientation in the Quilt Assembly Diagram.

**Step 16:** Sew the blocks together to form rows. Press the rows to the left in the odd numbered rows and to the right in the even numbered rows.

Step 17: Sew the rows together to form the quilt center. Press the row seams open.

**Step 18:** Sew inner borders to the left and right sides of the quilt. Press toward borders, and trim to be even with the quilt. Sew inner borders to top and bottom of the quilt. Press toward borders, and trim to be even with the quilt.

**Step 19:** Sew outer borders to the left and right sides of the quilt. Press toward the borders, and trim to be even with the quilt. Sew outer borders to top and bottom of the quilt. Press toward borders, and trim to be even with the quilt.

Your quilt top is complete. Baste, quilt, bind and enjoy!

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
