I am going to take you through the exciting journey of making your first quilt. The best news is that learning to quilt is easy! Just remember, good habits = beautiful quilts.

Summary from Video:

FABRIC

- \bullet Quilting fabric is 100% cotton, and comes in both printed and woven varieties
- Top Quality vs Cheap you get what you pay for!
- Color and texture are the most exciting parts of quilting. The possibilities are endless!
- Scale (choose a variety of print sizes)
 - Large florals, small prints, stripes, dots, plaids, solid, mottled, tone on tone, miniatures
- Pre-Cuts: Jelly Rolls, Charms, Mini Charms, Layer Cakes, Fat Quarters (FQ), Fat Eighths (F8)
 - Precision Cut
 - Save Time
 - Get a piece of every fabric in a collection
 - Finish your project sooner

FABRIC STASH.

Quilt fabric collections are available for a VERY limited time. You should buy fabric for an entire quilt all at once.

When you find a fabric you like, buy it now, and save it for later! This is known as a Fabric Stash.

- If you like it = buy 1 yard
- If you love it = buy 2 yards
- If you can't live without it = buy 5 yards

Sewing Machines _____

Careful! You'll get what you pay for! If you are using a machine that has been handed down, get it serviced before you begin.

I recommend buying from a local dealer because:

- Classes usually available
- Easy servicing (once a year)
- Warranty

Needs to have 3 basic stitches:

- Straight Stitch
- Zig Zag Stitch
- Blanket Stitch (sometimes called a Buttonhole Stitch)

Take the time to learn to use your machine

- It's very important to thread your machine exactly as instructed.
- Thread is the glue that holds your quilt together! Use high-quality thread. We recommend MasterPiece by Superior Threads. Throw out old and poor-quality thread.
- Wind bobbins as instructed; these affect your tension!
- Marking ¼" or using ¼" presser foot is essential for an accurate ¼" seam.

Let's Begin Cutting! _____

Remember: Accuracy matters!

Hold the cutter in your right hand, and secure the ruler with your left hand, little finger over edge to stabilize. If you are left handed, simply reverse the process. Remember to close your blade when you're done cutting. It's very dangerous if left open!

Let's make a practice cut. Cut a 2" strip with a long, easy motion. Sub-cut several rectangles, making sure to cut off selvages.

Let's Sew! _____

Always start a new project with a new, sharp needle.

Establish a ¼" seam allowance. This is one of the most important aspects of quilting. We recommend using a ¼" presser foot. Get one if you can! If not:

- Use small ruler. Place it under the presser foot on your machine. Slowly lower the needle to the ¼" mark.
- Line up ruler with marks on your stitch plate so it's square. Mark this with several strips of blue painters tape.

Sew two strips Right Sides Together (RST) with a ¼" seam, guiding your fabric along the mark.



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Ironing: Use Magic Sizing on the wrong side of fabric, and iron out wrinkles and folds.

Pressing: Set seam.

Open and finger press seam flat. Press seam.

Your sewn strips should now measure 3½" wide. If not, double check your strips are cut to exactly 2" wide and your seam allowance is exactly ¼" wide.

Seam Ripping (or "Un-sewing") _____

The object is to remove stitches quickly and efficiently without stretching the fabric

- Use seam ripper to cut every 3-4 stitches
- Pull bobbin thread to remove
