

ROLL-UP ORGANIZER

Finishes to approx. 8" x 20"

PLEASE NOTE

All seams are 1/4" WOF = Width of Fabric

REQUIRED MATERIALS

- 8½" x 20½" (or a Fat 8th) for **outside**
- 8½" x 20½" (or a Fat 8th) for **inside**
- 5" x 20½" (or a 1/6 yard) for **pocket**
- (1) 20½" length and (1) 8" length (or 7/8 yard) elastic
- 8" x 20" (or 1/4 yard) fusible interfacing (20" wide)

RECOMMENDED PRODUCTS

- Olfa 45mm Rotary Cutter
- Creative Grids 6½" x 24½" Ruler #CGR24
- Clover Hot Press Ruler
- Clover Flower Head Pins
- Clover Point 2 Point Turner

CUT FABRICS

From **Fabric A**, cut:

- (1) 8½" x 20½" rectangle for **outside**

From **Fabric B**, cut:

- (1) 8½" x 20½" rectangle for **inside**

From **Fabric C**, cut:

- (1) 5" x 20½" rectangle for **pocket**

From **fusible interfacing**, cut:

- (1) 8" x 20" rectangle

From **elastic**, cut:

- (1) 20½" length
- (1) 8" length

FUSE INTERFACING

Fuse **interfacing** to wrong side of **Fabric A**, leaving a 1/4" seam allowance on all sides. (This will reduce bulk at the seams, making it easier to turn.)

This is your organizer outside. Set aside for a later step.

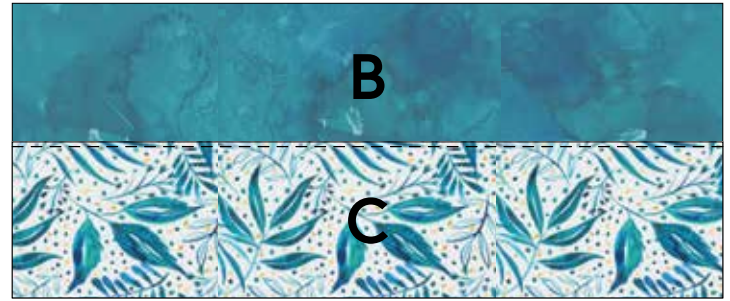
Organizer Outside
(fused with interfacing)

PREPARE POCKET

Choose one long edge of **Fabric C** to be the “top” of the pocket. Fold and press this long edge under $\frac{1}{4}$ " and press. Fold under another $\frac{1}{4}$ " and press. Top stitch to create a finished edge for your pocket.

Place pocket fabric, right side up, on top of **Fabric B**, right side up, aligning raw edges on sides and bottom. Baste along raw edges with a $\frac{1}{8}$ " seam allowance.

This is your organizer inside.



Organizer Inside

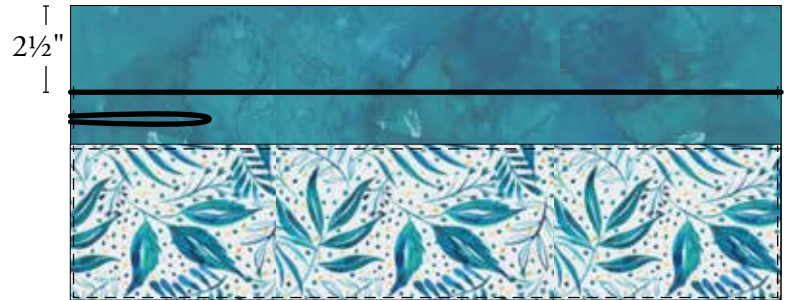
ADD ELASTIC

Using a temporary marking pen, draw a line $2\frac{1}{2}$ " from top edge of organizer inside.

Align $20\frac{1}{2}$ " length of **elastic** along this line. Tack both ends of elastic $\frac{1}{8}$ " from raw edges.

Fold 8" length of elastic in half to form a loop. (Be sure there are no twists in the elastic.) Place loop halfway between drawn line and top edge of pocket, aligning raw ends with raw edge of organizer inside. Tack elastic $\frac{1}{8}$ " from raw edge.

We recommend pinning loop against fabric to keep it from being sewn into the seam in the next step.



ASSEMBLE ORGANIZER

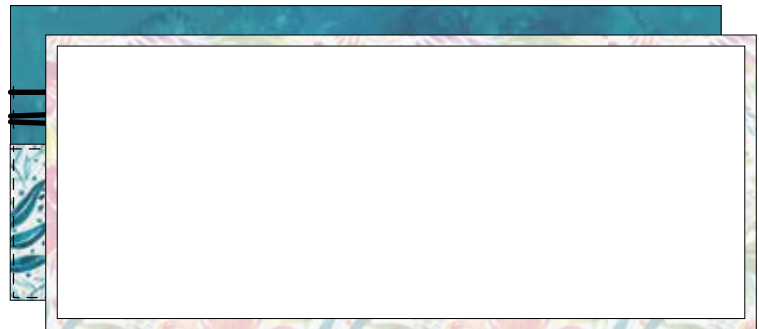
Place organizer outside on top of organizer inside, right sides together. Pin well. Sew around all four sides, leaving a 6" opening on the bottom side. Clip corners.

Turn right side out, and use point turner to push out corners.

Fold and press opening under $\frac{1}{4}$ ".

Top stitch around entire organizer, moving elastic out of the way as needed.

Press. *If you used a marking pen that erases with heat, avoid the area where you drew the line. If it disappears, you can remark it, this time $2\frac{1}{4}$ " from top edge.*

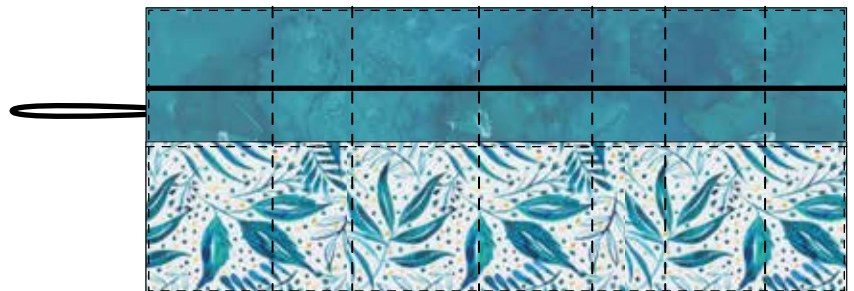


ADD POCKET PARTITIONS

Mark partitions at various desired widths. We recommend securing the elastic with pins to keep it in place along the traced horizontal line during this step.

Sew partitions from bottom to top, being careful not to catch elastic in presser foot.

Roll up organizer, and wrap looped elastic around roll to secure.
