PLEASE NOTE

All seams are ¼" WOF = Width of Fabric

REQUIRED MATERIALS

- ¹/₂ yard *each* of (7) collage fabrics for **snowball blocks**
- $10" \times 10"$ each of (14) mottled fabrics for cornerstones
- 2 yards black for **snowball corners**, **sashing**, **borders** and **binding**
- 3 yards for **backing**

CUT FABRICS

From *each* of (7) collage fabrics, *fussy cut*:

• (18) 3¹/₂" × 3¹/₂" squares for **snowball blocks** This will produce a total of (126) squares. You only need (120); you will have (6) left over.



Outline 3½" squares with FriXion pen (or white marking pen) to fit (18) squares on each collage fabric. Cut out on drawn lines.

From *each* of (14) mottled fabrics, cut:

• (8) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " × $1\frac{1}{2}$ " squares for **cornerstones**

From **black**, cut:

- (6) 2¹/₂" × WOF for **binding**
- (6) 1¹/₂" × WOF, pieced and subcut to
 (2) 1¹/₂" × 47¹/₂" for side border
 - (2) $1\frac{1}{2}$ × $41\frac{1}{2}$ for top/bottom border
- (108) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " × $3\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangles for vertical sashing
- (110) 1¹/₂" × 3¹/₂" rectangles for horizontal sashing
- (480) 1¹/₄" × 1¹/₄" for snowball corners



Finishes to 41¹/₂" × 49¹/₂"

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SNOWBALL BLOCKS



Place a black **snowball corner** in each corner of a **snowball block** square, right sides together, aligning raw edges. Using a white marking pen, draw a diagonal line from one corner to the other on each black square (*as shown at left*). Sew ON each line.

Trim excess fabric to a ¼" seam. Fold corner triangles back *(as shown at right)*, and press seams open.

Continue for a total of (120) snowball blocks. Each snowball block should measure $3\frac{1}{2}$ " × $3\frac{1}{2}$ ".



ASSEMBLE QUILT______ Refer to Quilt Assembly Diagram (*right*).

Arrange snowball blocks and **vertical sashing** into (12) rows of (10) snowball blocks per row. Sew together in rows. Press toward sashing.

Arrange **horizontal sashing** and **cornerstones** into (11) rows of (10) horizontal sashings per row. Sew together in rows. Press toward sashing.

Sew rows together. Press open.


Sew **side border** to left and right sides of quilt. Press toward border.

Sew **top/bottom border** to top and bottom of quilt. Press toward border.

Finish Quilt_____

Layer quilt top, batting, and **backing**. Quilt as desired.

Sew **binding** strips together into one continuous strip. Fold binding in half lengthwise with wrong sides together, and press. Sew binding to the front side of the quilt, starting at any side. Turn the binding over and hand sew or machine stitch to the back of the quilt.
