# Aunt Dinah Block Flannel QUilt as featured on our YouTube channel: 

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## FABRIC REQUIREMENTS <br> - 23/4 yards Cream 1

- 2 yards Cream 2
- 1 FQ each of 20 dark colors
- $2 / 3$ yard for inner border
- $23 / 4$ yards for outer border and binding
- 3 yards of 108 " flannel for backing OR 8 yards of $44^{\prime \prime}$ flannel for backing


## BEFORE YOU BEGIN

Please read through all instructions carefully before beginning.
Each block finishes at $12^{\prime \prime} \times 12$ ".
Completed quilt finishes at $871 / 22^{\prime \prime} \times 99^{1 / 2}$ ".
Terms and definitions to know:
RST = Right Sides Together
WOF = Width of Fabric
LOF = Length of Fabric

## CUT THE FABRIC

From Cream 1 flannel, cut:

- (84) $51 / 4$ " $\times 5^{1 / 4}$ " squares for hourglass units

## MAKE HOURGLASS UNITS

For each block, you will use (2) Cream $15 \frac{1}{4}$ " $\times 5 \frac{1}{4}$ " squares and (2) Dark 51/4" $\times 51 / 4 "$ squares.
Layer squares, RST, and cut in half, twice, diagonally $\triangle$.
Sew Cream 1 triangle to Dark triangle; press toward Dark. Repeat for second Cream 1/ Dark triangle.

Sew Cream 1/Dark triangles together; press seams toward Darks.
Unit should measure $41 / 22^{\prime \prime} \times 41 / 22^{\prime \prime}$.
Repeat to create (168) Hourglass Units with various Dark flannels.


## MAKE CAT'S CRADLE UNITS

For each block, you will use (4) $23 / 4$ " $\times 23 / 4$ " Cream 1 squares, (4) $233 / 4 \times 33 / 4 "$ Dark rectangles, and (2) $5^{\prime \prime} \times 6^{\prime \prime}$ Cream 2 rectangles.
Use Cat's Cradle Tool and/or follow along with video to assemble unit.
Completed units should measure $41 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 41 / 2$.
Repeat to create (168) Corner Units with various Dark flannels.


## MAKE BLOCKS

For each block, you will use (4) Cat's Cradle Units, (4)
Hourglass Units, and (1) Center.
Using the diagram for reference, sew the units together in rows, pressing seams open.

Then, sew the rows together into a block, pressing seams open.
Block should measure $12^{1 / 2} 2^{\prime \prime} \times 12^{1 / 2} 2^{\prime \prime}$.
Repeat these steps to make (42) Blocks.

## ASSEMBLE THE QUILT

On a large work surface, arrange your blocks in 7 rows of 6 . Once you are pleased with the arrangement, sew blocks together in rows, then sew rows together.
Quilt top should now measure $72 \frac{1}{2}$ " $\times 841 / 2^{\prime \prime}$.

## ADD BORDERS

Sew inner border strips into one long strip.
Sew an inner border strip to the left and right sides of the quilt. Press seams toward border, and trim to be even with the quilt.

Sew an inner border strip to the top and bottom of the quilt. Press seams toward border, and trim to be even with the quilt.

Sew an outer border strip to the left and right sides of the quilt. Press seams toward outer border, and trim to be even with the quilt.

Sew an outer border strip to the top and bottom of the quilt. Press seams toward outer border, and trim to be even with the quilt.


## Finish THE QUILT

Layer quilt top, batting, and backing. Quilt as desired.
Sew binding strips together into one continuous strip. Fold binding in half lengthwise with wrong sides together, and press. Sew binding to the front side of the quilt, starting at any side. Turn the binding over and hand stitch to the back of the quilt.
